Throughout the holiday season, Frontenac County Childcare Centre will continue to:

- Reinforce masking and hand hygiene etiquette, as well as physical distancing
- Limit interactions between groups of children and staff/providers
- Ensure that everyone is screened before they enter the child care premises
- Perform enhanced cleaning and disinfecting of the toys, equipment, and premises.
- As a reminder, individuals showing symptoms of illness should not attend the child care program. All children, students, staff, and visitors must be screened for symptoms of illness every day before attending school or child care. To help meet this requirement, you may use either [the provincial COVID-19 school screening tool](#) or, the screening tool required by your school board, child care provider, or local public health unit. We encourage you to visit [Ontario.ca/covidresponse](https://ontario.ca/covidresponse) to learn the public health measures in place in our community and remind you that these measures could change depending on public health trends, so please visit the website regularly. We also suggest checking out KFL&A website as they may also have helpful resources and supports.
